Background

In 2014, the General Assembly adopted resolution 68/268 on strengthening and enhancing the effective functioning of the Treaty Body System. Two aspects of this resolution ensure accountability in its implementation: the biennial report of the Secretary-General on the state of the Treaty Body System and the proposed 2020 Review.

The Geneva Academy of International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights coordinates an academic research project that aims to yield innovative proposals and solutions for the Treaty Body System without weakening international human rights protection. The project is designed in a decentralized manner, generating partnerships with research institutions around the globe who are co-organizing regional consultations to allow for broad and varied input. The Geneva Academy will consolidate the outcomes of regional and thematic meetings as well as individual contributions and feed them into the intergovernmental process in the lead-up to the 2020 Review.

Annual Conference, 8-9 December

This meeting will be divided into two distinct parts, the first being a day and a half of expert meetings and the second, a half day dedicated to exchanges with stakeholders, States and NGOs.

The expert meeting on Thursday and Friday morning will be held at the Villa Moynier, premises of the Geneva Academy. It will be a private round-table discussion and there will be working groups to discuss particular topics. The plenary sessions will generally be moderated by the organizers.

On Friday afternoon the meeting with stakeholders, States and NGOs will include two separate briefing discussions and will take place in Room V at the Palais des Nations.
